TUITION DISCOUNTS

1. Multiple siblings (excludes half-day and 2-3 day Kindergarten)
 - a. There is a 20% discount on total tuition when 2 children are enrolled all day.
 - b. There is a 30% discount on total tuition when 3 children are enrolled all day.
 - c. The fourth child may attend FREE (tuition only).
 - d. Parents who pay the entire amount of yearly tuition on or before September 1 qualify for the following discount:
K-6 (\$100), 7-12 (\$200).
2. Referrals (excludes half-day Kindergarten)
 - a. Current families can receive up to \$400 in tuition credits per new family enrolled.
 - b. New families can receive up to \$800 in tuition credits.
 - c. New family's initial interview must occur between March 1 – September 1 and bring the referral coupon.

ADDITIONAL FEES

- \$50 for New Student Testing fee (grades 2-12)
- \$20 for all NSF (non-sufficient funds) checks
- \$40 lab fee for Biology
- \$20 lab fee for Chemistry, Physics, Computer 9-12th
- \$160 lab fee for Foreign Language
- A \$15 late fee is charged for payments received after the 15th. If payment is not received within **thirty days** (15 days for the August and May payment), the student is not permitted to attend classes.
- Before and after school Extended Care is also available (information on a separate sheet)
- \$35 for 7-12th Handbells per semester
- \$225 for instrumental private lessons per semester
- \$40-\$90 Choir/Handbells 9-12th performance outfit
- \$150 Senior High Graduation fee
- \$35 School Retreat fee

HIGHLIGHTS OF TUITION AND FEES CHANGES FOR 2023-2024

ENROLLMENT FEES are similar this year with regular and late enrollments of \$50/100 per student (paid up front through FACTS FamilyPortal) based on the date of enrollment. Please see the chart on the front page. During the online enrollment process, families who pay more than the maximum per family (\$150/300) will receive a credit on their account for the difference (applied during the summer). **NOTE: All students must re-enroll online through a link on the FACTS FamilyPortal.** Each family will also pay a \$25/\$55 fee for FACTS tuition management dependent upon the tuition plan chosen.

MATERIAL AND ACTIVITY FEES have been adjusted according to current textbook rates. The material and activity fee covers the cost of the textbooks along with other items. In addition, each family will receive one yearbook. Extra yearbooks may be purchased at an additional cost.

TUITION has a very slight increase this year.

ADDITIONAL FEES – The 9-12th grade choir/hand bells performance outfit expense will vary per student depending on if the student already has items from the previous year.

ATHLETIC FEES had a slight increase. The fee for each sport covers the actual cost of that sport's referees, transportation to away games, uniform replacement every five years, and equipment replacement. The greater expense generated by the athletic program, including coaching salaries, tournament fees, gym and field maintenance, additional utilities, liability insurance, and vehicle insurance, is met primarily through the general tuition paid by all students.
